UGA- Study Abroad - Dance and Community in Ghana

Program Description

The program offers a unique opportunity for movement study, exploration, community engagement and performance in the cultural and historically rich surroundings of Ghana. A study in practical and theoretical knowledge of movement, history and culture, wellbeing and community performance experiences in different cities across Ghana. Students will have wonderful opportunities to work with locally acclaimed dance company through collaboration, learning a variety of dance movement styles or creating dance choreographies on their own accompanied by traditional/contemporary instruments. The Program begins in the city of Accra and continues throughout some of the surrounding cities. Students will have the opportunity to learn about the background of each tribe/community they visit and engage/interact with the people.

The program also is an introduction as well as an overview experience designed to educate students on the history of trans-Atlantic slave trade, colonization, decolonization and the unparalleled and unmatched contributions African people have made to human civilization.

The program will run from May 14th - June 12th, 2024.
